Average score



The average quiz score across all 57 respondents was 5.3 points out of 10.

The good news



Question 7 is the one most people got right.



Do you need to follow normal road rules and wear a helmet when riding an e-bike?



98% of respondents got it right.

14% Question 6: Understanding the obligations of retailers for selling e-bikes in NSW

18% Question 3: The maximum legal power output allowed for e-bikes in NSW

33% Question 9: The speed limit that applies to any bike on footpaths or shared paths

Takeaways

with the caveats of a very small sample size and selection bias



The quiz results suggest that...



Owning an e-bike and working in the active transport sector improve one's awareness of current e-bike laws in NSW.



Simply owning an e-bike has little impact on one's awareness compared to working in the sector (and vice versa), but both are helpful.



Most importantly, the current laws in NSW seem unclear for e-bike owners and sector professionals (who got about ½ to ½ of questions wrong, on average). Based on this, it is even harder for the general public to make the right decisions and adhere to laws when buying or riding e-bikes.

E-bikes are an increasingly popular and sustainable form of active transport that can play a key part in achieving mode shift on our road networks. But government must ensure e-bike rules are clear, accessible and fit-for-purpose to minimise the risk of injuries for pedestrians, riders and other road users.
